

2024 Term 3 Curriculum in Year 1

at Highland Reserve State School



English

Students listen to, read, view and retell events from a variety of picture books and stories that are familiar and from different cultures. They will sequence text events in order and will write a retell based on a familiar story. Students will apply spelling patterns to most-one and two syllable words and will write using an increasing number of high frequency words. They will write using correct sentence boundary punctuation and capital letters for proper nouns. When reading, students will read imaginative and informative texts. They will continue to develop their skills by reading fluently, monitoring meaning, and comprehending texts.

Maths

Students will give and follow directions to familiar locations using positional and directional language. They will investigate length and capacity by measuring and comparing different objects. Students will learn to tell the time to the half hour and will describe time durations. They will solve simple subtraction problems using a range of strategies and will continue to explore numbers up to 100.

Science

Students will investigate the observable features of a variety of landscapes and skies. They will pose and respond to questions, make predictions and share ideas with others through guided investigations about changes in the sky and landscapes and how they affect everyday life.

Digital Technologies

Students will learn and apply Digital Technologies knowledge and skills through guided play and tasks integrated into other subject areas. They will recognise and explore how digital and information systems are used for particular purposes in daily life.
