

2023 Term 4 Curriculum in Year 1

at Highland Reserve State School



English

Students will read and compare a range of fiction and non-fiction texts about animals and living things. Students will learn about the features of information texts, and apply this in their own writing, as they write about a range of different animals.

Maths

Students will continue to explore numbers by recognising, skip counting, sequencing, partitioning and locating numbers up to 100. They will investigate length and capacity by measuring and comparing different objects. Through guided inquiry, students will learn about Australian coins and their values.

Science

Students will make links between the features of living things and the environment where they are found. They will explore a range of habitats and consider the differences between healthy and unhealthy habitats. Students will develop inquiries and predict how changes to habitats can affect how the needs of living things are met.
